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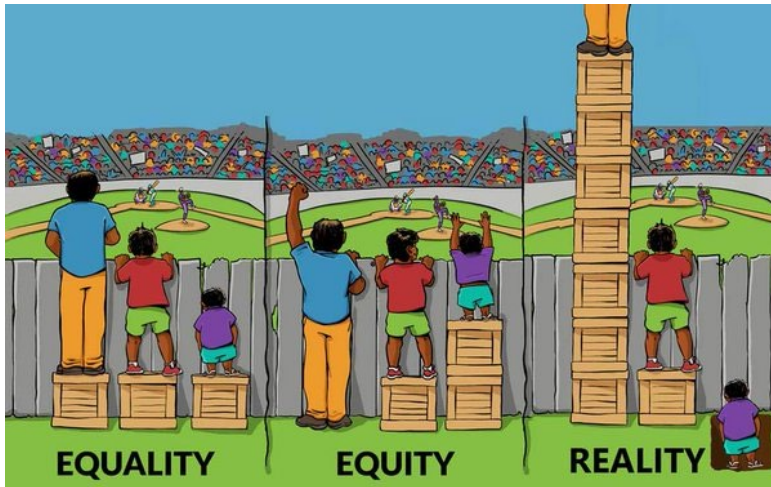


Planen – stand-in for eksperten

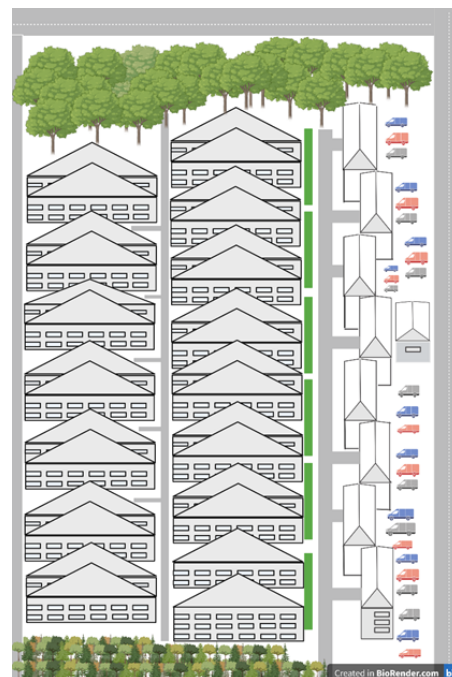
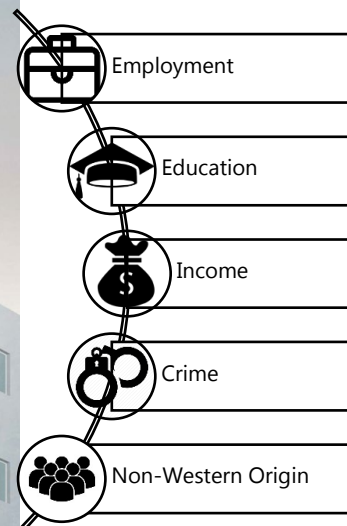

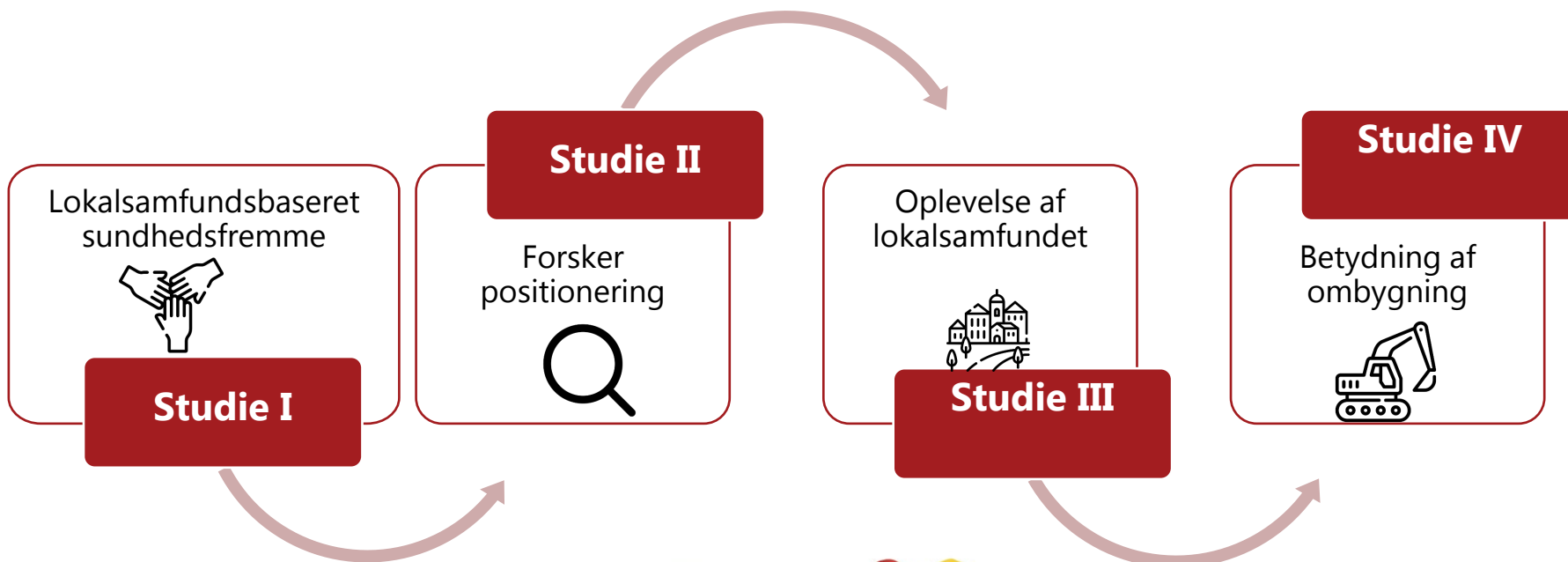


Formål

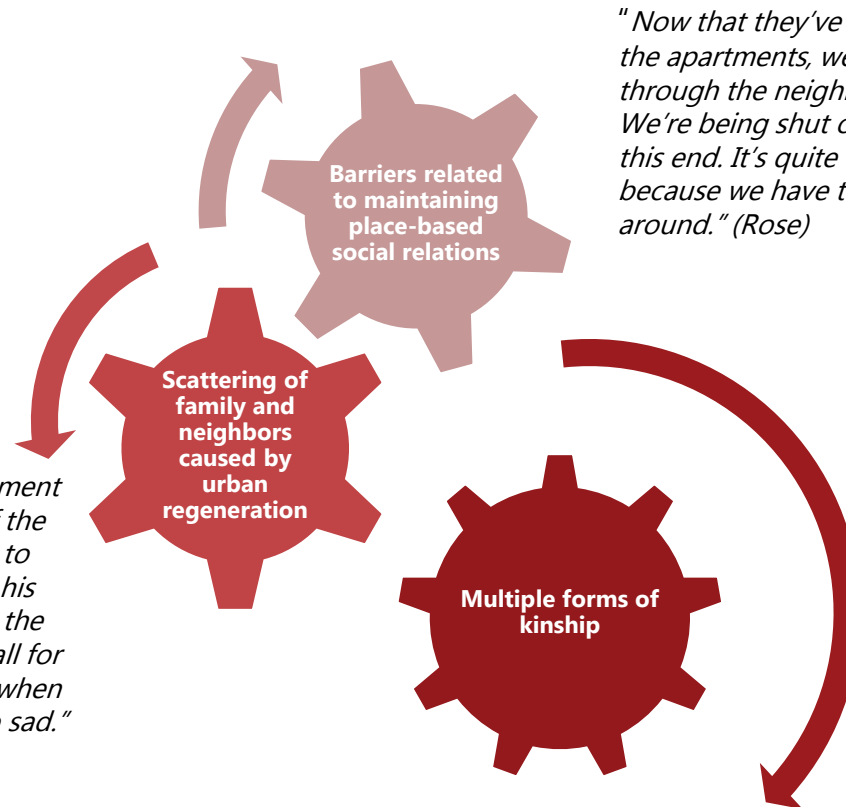

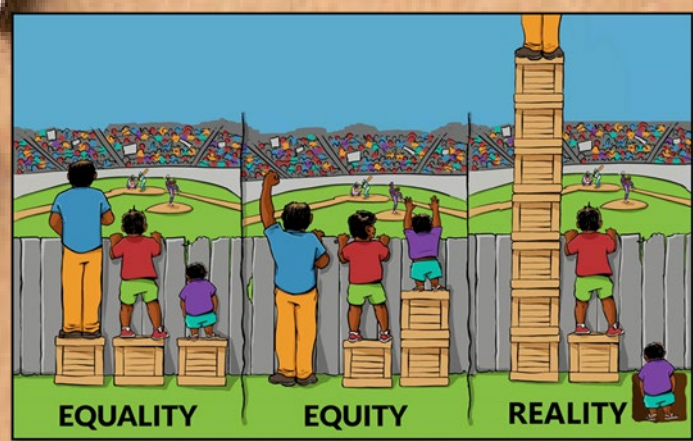


"Now that they've started demolishing the apartments, we can't walk straight through the neighborhood anymore. We're being shut out down here in this end. It's quite troublesome because we have to walk all the way around." (Rose)
